Back by popular demand **Return to the USS Hornet** Saturday, November 11

Our Club family outing to the USS Hornet was sold out last year, so we've scheduled a return visit.

At 10 a.m. on Saturday, November 11, we'll embark on a docent-led tour of the aircraft carrier, USS Hornet, a ship rich in history and now in Alameda as an exciting Bay Area museum.

The Hornet, the eighth U.S. military ship to bear the name, served as the recovery craft for the Apollo 11 and 12 landing missions as well as the base for the famous Doolittle raid of WWII. This tour will be a perfect opportunity for young and old alike to see firsthand one of the U.S. Navy's most highly-decorated ships and a National Historical Landmark.

Admission for this event is \$8 for adults, \$4 for children (payable at the Hornet Museum) plus \$5 per adult (payable to the Harvard Club) to cover the cost of an exclusive docent tour (not available to the general public).
