### **Love in the Sand Dunes**


#### Saturday, February 7th, 10:00 am Hillsdale Mall - Ano Nuevo

## **Enjoy The Art of Song: Gustav Mahler**

Gustav Mahler's great fame rests primarily on his symphonies,

depending on how you count them, ten and one-half (!) in number. But Mahler began his compositional career as a composer of songs, and the essence of his songs - their emotional, spiritual, and musical substance - lies at the heart of his symphonic music, from the First Symphony all the way through to Das

Lied von der Erde. We'll listen to songs from Des Knaben Wunderhorn, Songs of a Wayfarer, Kindertotenlieder and Das Lied con der Erde, and observe how they became part and substance of Mahler's symphonies.

The afternoon's performance will fea-

ture Christòpheren Nomura, baritone with Robert Greenberg and Daniel Lockert, piano. A post-reception with refreshments will allow us to gather and rub elbows with the performers!

# Wynton Marsalis & Lincoln Center Jazz

Hear Wynton Marsalis with the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra at the Masonic Auditorium in San Francisco. Wynton Marsalis is the most accomplished and

acclaimed jazz artist and composer of his generation as well as a distinguished classical musician. Mr. Marsalis has helped propel jazz to the forefront of American culture through his brilliant

performances, recordings, compositions, educational efforts, and his vision as Artistic Director of the internationally renowned arts organization Jazz at Lincoln Center (J@LC).

Mr. Marsalis's prominent position in the performing arts was secured in April 1997, when he became the first jazz artist to be awarded the prestigious Pulitzer Prize in music, for his work Blood on the Fields commissioned by J@LC.

Under Marsalis' leadership, the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra defines jazz

> today. For more than ten years, fifteen of the nation's top instrumentalists have comprised the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra, the resident ensemble of Jazz at Lincoln Center. The Orchestra spends half

of each year on tour, bringing the history of America's unique artform to life across the country and around the world.

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# **Dance with Paul Taylor & Company**

#### Saturday, April 3rd, 8:00 pm San Francisco, CA

Paul Taylor is a maverick modern dancemaker, going his own way with his own style no matter the trend or the times," proclaims The Washington Post. Now an annual tradition, the Paul Taylor Dance Company will perform this year in a three-program, two-week season, the Company's most extensive outside of New York.

Watch the following four dynamic performances: Aureole (1962) with music by Handel's Concerti Grossi in C & F & "Jeptha"; 3 Epitaphs (1956) with music by Early New Orleans Jazz; Sunset (1983) with music by Edward Elgar; Piazzolla Caldera (1997) with music by Astor Piazzolla & Jerzy Peterburshsky.

Celebrating its 50th anniversary year, the Company has chosen San Francisco to kick off its ambitious and already-talked-about 50-state tour. Paul Taylor himself is currently creating new works for the anniversary and putting together a program of past repertory including revivals of important but seldom-seen dances.

For example, Octavio Roca of the San Francisco Chronicle called Piazzolla



Caldera "an exhilarating...delicious melting pot of Argentine rhythms and all-American moves. Appropriating the

tango without once betraying his own

style, Taylor here makes use of the music of Astor Piazzolla in steamy, sexy ways that leave all the several recent tango musicals far behind."



### **Hike in the Heart of San Francisco**

Saturday, February 21st, 10:30 am San Francisco, CA

Rescheduled from the rainout on 12/6/03! The northern section of McLaren Park is now a safe and pleasant destination for families, dog walkers, runners, and city residents craving

a bit of nature. With McLaren's 318 sprawling acres, inside San Francisco city limits, only Golden Gate Park and the Presidio have larger recreation footprints. The park's



greatest asset is its topography. Unlike flat Golden Gate Park, McLaren boasts hills, which make it feel less like a park and more like open space. Although McLaren is comprised of mostly exotic vegetation, with some grassland, new installations of native plants are helping to reestablish a balance.

We will start at the parking lot off Shelley Drive, and create a hike on a

seemingly-infinite assortment of paved and dirt paths. From Mission St. in the Excelsior District, turn east onto Persia Ave. Continue on Persia as it transitions into Mansell at the junction with Brazil,

then turn left onto John F. Shelley Drive. Proceed 1/2 mile and turn right into a parking lot.
