Come to the University Club on Tuesday, January 23rd and join merchants and wayfarers along the ancient Silk Road to the exotic cities of Khiva, Bukhara, and legendary Samarkand - capital of mighty Tamerlane's empire. The rulers of these three cities, seats of powerful khanates, built magnificent palaces, mosques, and mausoleums, many of which have been richly restored by Soviet and Uzbek authorities.

During this fascinating pictorial sojourn you will hear retired Foreign Service Officer, Frank Rettenberg ('52), describe the monumental architecture and unique social settings that he observed during his recent trip to Uzbekistan in June 1999. In the process, he will review the area's rich and complex historical legacy from the 10th Century Samanid dynasty through the transition from Russian to Soviet rule to independence. Mr. Rettenberg will also touch on this newly independent country's political, economic and environmental difficulties.

## Getting to know your Club better How the Schools Committee Works

The Schools Committee fulfills several important roles.
First, it acts as a liason between the Club and its members and the Harvard Admissions Office in Cambridge. If representatives of the Admissions Office are planning visits to the Bay Area, or have questions concerning the Bay Area and Bay Area applicants and schools, they contact the Schools Committee.

Second, the committee stays in contact with the various CountyCoChairs who manage the actual interviewing process in the Bay Area, and helps them with any problems or issues that may arise. For example, when the Club receives inquiries about interviewing from alumni, the Schools Committee contacts the prospective interviewer and puts them in touch with the appropriate County Co-Chair.

Third, it finds hosts for three informal receptions per year for admittees: one in late December for the Early Action admittees; one in mid-April for all admittees and their parents; and one in midAugust for those who have decided to attend Harvard and are about to leave for their first year. At the December and August receptions we attempt to have current students attend; curent students are usually in Cambridge at the time of the April party, so we recruit a few recent graduates for that reception.

The admittees appreciate having a chance to question current students and recent grads. All three events require a modest amount of work getting the necessary information from the Admissions Office for invitations, finding a location, preparing food and punch or soft drinks, welcoming the admittees and answering questions, and giving a short booster speech (at the December and April parties) to encourage the admittees to select Harvard.

To assist with any of the activities of the Schools Committee, please contact Peggy Brown '65, Vice-President--Schools. Peggy has been interviewing applicants since the late 1960's, with a break during the time her children (Emmy '95 and Eric '97) were high school juniors and seniors.

Peggy attended Radcliffe in the early ' 60 's, when classes were coed but the Radcliffe Quad was not, and received her Radcliffe diploma (countersigned by President Pusey) in 1965. She attended Harvard Law School for two years as one of the 25 female members of the Class of 1968, but received her J.D. from Boalt Hall (U.C. Berkeley) when she and her husband, Tim Brown '64, Law '67, moved to California. She has been active in the San Francisco Radcliffe Club as well as the Harvard Club. When not promoting Harvard, she works in the Law Department of PG\&E, is active in her church, and is a board member of an organization providing housing for seniors.
